



HERMES Survey Kiosk (HSK)

The use of the **HSK** has taken-off over the last term, with more than 200 schools now registered as users of the Kiosk. Your school can access a free no-obligation 30-day trial to use the **HSK** simply by registering at www.radii.org

New Features

The features of the **HSK** are continually being expanded as the final stages of development are implemented.

Build your own survey from our HSK 'leggo blocks'

- Schools can now build their surveys from sections of 3–5 questions that focus on a specific topic — no need to start from a full survey.
- Alternatively, start from a pre-built survey — then delete the sections you don't want and add new sections.

Summary tables have been added to the reports which are now provided in Excel Workbook format to make it easier to cut-and-past tables and graphs to school reports and PowerPoint presentations.

Other New Features

The following additional features will become available in the **HSK** during Term 3.

- Analysis of the data from individual surveys for specific subgroups (eg. for boys/girls, or by year-level).
- Aggregated reports — for data across classrooms and year-levels within a school.

Adaptive questions — find out why the parent is not satisfied

- Adaptive 'drill-down' questions based on previous responses can be used to enhance interpretation of the data — eg. a dissatisfied parent can be asked a follow-up question to find out why they are dissatisfied.
- Make a 1-click duplicate of your survey to share with colleagues.
- Give respondents a 1-time code to stop multiple responses from the same respondent.
- Send automatic reminders to those who have not responded.

National Compliance Reporting

A range of specially designed surveys have been added to the **HSK** for reporting requirements on:

- parent satisfaction
- student satisfaction
- teacher satisfaction.

Professor Cuttance is developing a framework for collecting and reporting the data required for formal compliance purposes in the Non-Government sector. Non-Government school systems report on their compliance as a system — *radii.org* is working with systems to provide an efficient way of gathering the required information from individual schools for compliance reporting by the school system.

The Tools required for both Non-Government School Systems and Independent Schools will be available by Term 4 for schools and school systems to collect all required data by the end of this year.

New Features Now Available

School excursion manager

- The new school excursion feature allows parents to book their child into an excursion, pay any required fees online and download the school's form to be signed and returned to authorise the school to take the student on the excursion.
- A reporting interface has been added for schools to access details of their bookings at any time.

Other New Features

The following additional features will come on-stream during Term 3.

Parent-teacher meetings diary

- Parent-teacher appointment scheduler.
- Booking system for rooms and facilities.
- Booking system for equipment.

Small Schools

- In response to requests from small schools, a new subscription category for schools with enrollments of less than 100 students has been introduced.
- The **HSK** subscription for small schools is \$200 per annum.
- Schools in all subscription categories can run as many surveys as they want each year.
